

THE HOLY GRAIL DYNASTY

—An Open Letter—

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Lord Aurelius III. Master of the Order of the Burning Phoenix

Distinguished Readers:

As you may have noted, all Holy Grail and Catalan pedigrees have been removed from *Sangrial*. It is true that I have left two related articles in Spanish, *El Duque Otger de Catalón y los Barones de la Fama*, and *La Reina Orable de Orange*, the latter also in English, *Queen Orable of Orange*, while a third article, *La Casa de Pinós*, also mentions the dynasty, as the House of Pinos might be another branch of the same.

The pedigrees have been deleted because I am no longer sure that Saint William “the Great” descends *in the male line* from Saint Jude “Thaddeus”, Saint James the Just, Saint Daniel and Saint David, as previously published in *Sangrial*. A descendant Saint Jude “Thaddeus”, named *Anne*, that is, *Hannah*, married the British King “Bran Bendigaid”, and Saint William might have been an *agnate* descendant of a son of this marriage. This was actually my first (unpublished) reconstruction of the pedigree, but after reading Professor Arthur J. Zuckerman’s *A Jewish Princedom in Feudal France, 768-900*, I did more research, and concluded that a descendant of Saint Jude “Thaddeus”, named *Lazarus* (Welsh *Llasar*), that is, ‘*Eli’azar* or ‘*El’azar*, who took the Holy Grail to Britain, giving it for temporary custody to “Bran Bendigaid”, must have himself been the agnate ancestor of Saint William, through a son named *James* (Welsh *Iago*). This was finally my published reconstruction, but I doubt its accuracy now. At least, the British Prince *Iago* that I thought issue of the Jewish Prince Lazarus (*Llasar*) is not related.

No comments on this matter have been posted before this open letter, because, for months, I have been *intellectually catatonic*, precisely because of the cataclysmic deadlock reached on this issue. I hope, but do not promise, to publish the revised pedigrees again, including a study about the critical relationship between the Royal House of David and the Catalan Royal Dynasty, thus, the possible links of succession in the Holy Grail Dynasty, and how credible the entire genealogy may be.

As previously mentioned, I thought earlier that the Royal House of Catalonia was Britannic, related to the Royal Davidic Dynasty through marriage, and would have published it as such if, as published in his book *A Jewish Princedom in Feudal France, 768-900*, Professor Arthur J. Zuckerman had not *discovered* that Saint William “the Great” was a *Prince of the House of David* and the *Western Exilarch of the Jews*. While Professor Zuckerman’s identification of Saint Williams’ father, Theudrich Makhir (Thierry Aimeri), with the Exilarch Natronai is unacceptable, my research had already followed the line though the epic Hero Lohengrin, that is, the Prince “Loheran” Warin in Old German (Warin “the Flaming”), frequently Latinised *Geriontius*, from the Celtic *Gereint* «*Flamm*» map Bresival, King of Catalonia, back to “Bran Bendigaid” —the historical first Christian King in Britain, Saint Lucius “the Great” (Lleufer “Mawr”), known in legend as “the Blessed Raven” (“Bran Bendigaid”), whose Old Britannic name was *Loucetios map Coilos*. He was King of Catalonia until the year 176, and an agnate descendant of Catualos I, who was the eponym King of Catalonia, reigning from before 56 B.C. to his death in 41 B.C. The Old Britannic diminutive of the name *Catualos* is *Catualanos*, later Cymric and Welsh *Catwallain*, *Cadwallein*, *Cadwallon* (Spanish *Catalán*, with the variant *Catalón* given as surname to some princes the dynasty in legends, as in *Otger de Catalón*). The Catalans were called *Catalvvelavni* (*Catuuelauni*) in Britain and *Catalavni* (*Catalauni*) in Gaul by the Romans.

Because of Professor Zuckerman’s *discoveries*, though immediately rejecting his unbelievable identification of Makhir with Natronai, I started to search for the agnate link, and found that, according to the *Mabinogion*, the Holy Grail was brought to Britain by a Jewish Prince (though not called *Jewish* explicitly). In the *Mabinogion*, the *Holy Grail* was paganised into a *Cauldron of Rebirth* (perhaps through confusion with cauldrons that may have played a role in older Celtic mythology), but the origin of the legend recorded in the *Mabinogion* is obvious, and the Master of the Holy Grail who brought it to Britain was named *Llasar* —unquestionably *Lazarus*, from the Hebrew אליעזר [‘ELI‘EZAR] or אֵלְעָזָר [‘EL‘AZAR], who was called a “giant”, but much more importantly, a “crafty trader” (a very “Jewish” qualification according to Europeans). Moreover, it was this Prince *Lazarus* who gave the Holy Grail to King “Bran Bendigaid”. The rest is obvious, it must have been a Saint Lazarus, descendant of Saint Jude “Thaddeus” (and his cousin-wife Saint Mary, sister to Saint Lazarus of Bethany), who settled in Britain and whose

descendants (surely intermarried with those of Saint Lucius “the Blessed Raven”) continued the line through Saint William “the Great” —the male line being necessarily from Saint David to Saint William.

Nonetheless, it seems that I made a big mistake after this, thinking that a Britannic Prince named *Iago* (who is not given any ancestors in the *Manuel d'Histoire, de Généalogie et de Chronologie de tous les États du Globe, depuis les temps les plus reculés jusqu'à nos jours* (Stokvis, Anthony Marinus Hendrik Johan), was the missing link, since one of the various spellings of the name *James* is *Iago*. Some time later, I found a published pedigree of this Prince Iago, which, *if true*, makes him a fully Britannic Prince, but not Catalan nor closely related to “Bran Bendigaid”. Thus, my reconstructed pedigree seems to be wrong, although the essential succession Saint David — Saint Jude — Saint Lazarus (Llasar) — Saint William must be right if —and only if— the latter is an agnate descendant of Saint David.

I have tried to prove or disprove the essential pedigree by the way of agnate deoxyribonucleic acid (Y-DNA) testing results, but have not found enough information to do so. Indeed this is the “tip of the iceberg”... Can any Y-DNA samples from Saint Jude “Thaddeus” (or a contemporary agnate relative) ever be found? Probably not. It seems even more unlikely that Y-DNA material from an earlier agnate descendant of Saint Abraham be ever found. If the alleged *Cohanim haplotype* in the J1 genetic haplogroup is true, then Saint Jacob Israel also belonged to the J1 group, and, thus, if Saint William “the Great” was truly an agnate descendant of Saint David, he would have belonged to the J1 group also, and would all his agnate descendants.

However... is the so called *Cohanim haplotype* truly *Cohanim*? What if there was a displacement of the true *Cohanim* bloodline at the time of Herod? Then the alleged “*Cohanim haplotype*” would be a fraud! How can we ever take a Y-DNA sample from the remains of Saint Aharon or Saint Moses? Or, for that matter, a Y-DNA sample from anyone mentioned in the Old Testament with a complete agnate Abrahamid pedigree? I shall not affirm here that it is *impossible*, but from my relative ignorance, *it certainly seems to be so*.

Note that genetic scientists have not deciphered the human genome entirely, and that some kind of still unknown agnate genetic “marker” might exist which, when discovered, may show the currently published genetic “haplogroup pedigrees” to be wrong. But we cannot speculate about what is truly unknown. As they stand today, the published genetic “haplogroup pedigrees” are absolutely incompatible with the Biblical genealogies.

There is a great deal of misinformation posted on *Internet* —much of it deliberately fraudulent, such as that plague of pedigrees, articles and novels alleging that the Holy Messiah and the Saint Mary of Magdala were married and had issue.¹

Finally, having no intention of propagating errors, I may withhold further publications until an essential solution be found.

¹ The same gang and others also affirm that the Benjaminite Princess Saint Mary of Magdala was the same person as the Jehudahite Princess Saint Mary of Bethany, but Saint Mary of Magdala was at least the fiancée of Saint John son of Zebedee, and may have been his wife. On the other hand, Saint Mary of Bethany was married to her cousin Saint Jude “Thaddeus”, while her sister Saint Martha was married her cousin Saint Simon “the Zealot” (Saint Jude’s brother).
